CRITERIA**



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ELIGIBILITY AND QUALIFICATION CRITERIA

This section contains all the criteria that MRIDC will use to evaluate Bids and qualify Bidders through post-qualification. No other factors, methods or criteria shall be used other than specified in this bidding document. The Bidder shall provide all the information requested in the forms included in Annexures.

7 Evaluation Criteria for Bidders

7.1 Adequacy of Technical Proposal

Evaluation of the Bidder's Technical Proposal will include an assessment of the Bidder's technical capacity i.e. experience of having executed similar nature of work and Financial Capacity as detailed in the following paras.

7.2 Eligibility Criteria:

The successfully completed / physically completed / substantially completed work experience certificate issued from Govt. / Semi Govt. / PSU only will be considered for evaluation.

7.2.1 Technical Eligibility Criteria

- A. The Bidder must have successfully completed / physically completed / substantially completed any of the following during last **07 (seven) years, ending last day of month, previous to the month in which tender is invited:**

Three **similar works** each costing not less than the amount equal to 15% of advertised value of the tender,

or

Two **similar works** each costing not less than the amount equal to 20% of advertised value of the tender,

or

One **similar work** costing not less than the amount equal to 30% of advertised value of the tender.

- B. In case of JV, either the JV firm or lead member of the JV firm must satisfy the Technical Eligibility Criteria defined above and each other partner of JV (excluding lead partner) shall have minimum 5 years of experience in the similar work, from the last day of month, previous to the month in which tender is invited.

Note:

i. Definitions:

Similar Work: shall mean works executed for Railways, Highways, Expressways, Runways, Major District Roads, BRTS Works, Major Industrial Roads, Metro Rail, Airports, or similar infrastructure projects involving any of the following components:

- Earthwork in formation;
- Blanketing works;

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- Construction of Bridges;
- Rail Viaducts;
- Road Viaducts;
- Rail or Road Bridges; and/or
- Flyovers,

executed either under a single contract or multiple contracts with any Government Department, Semi-Government Organization, Public Sector Undertaking (PSU), or reputed Private Organization in India.

Successfully completed: It shall mean, that the work must be satisfactorily completed in all respect.

Physically completed: It shall mean, that the work should be physically completed in all respect, but the final bill may be under process.

Substantially completed: Value of work completed should be 90% or more of the latest contract value.

ii. Documents Required for Work Experience from Private Organizations

In case the work experience certificate is issued by a reputed Private Organization, the Bidder shall submit the following documents along with the bid, failing which such work experience shall not be considered for evaluation:

- a) Documentary proof establishing that the organization issuing the certificate had an average annual turnover of not less than Rs. 500 Crore during the last three financial years preceding the current financial year;
- b) Copy of the relevant work order/contract agreement;
- c) Copy of the final bill or latest paid bill duly certified by a Chartered Accountant in support of the claimed work experience; and
- d) Work experience/completion certificate issued by the concerned organization.

iii. Certification Requirements

The Bidder shall submit a certificate duly issued and verified by the client indicating whether the work is:

- Successfully Completed; or
- Physically Completed; or
- Substantially Completed.

In case of substantially completed works, the certificate shall clearly indicate the percentage of completion with reference to the latest contract value.

iv. Updation of Work Value

For successfully completed and physically completed works, the value of work executed shall be updated from the month of completion/physical completion, as applicable, up to the last day of the month previous to the month in which the tender is invited, considering an annual inflation rate of 5% for Indian Rupees.

No such updation shall be applicable in case of substantially completed works.

v. Acceptability of Certificates

Work experience certificates issued by Government Departments, Semi-Government Organizations, Public Sector Undertakings (PSUs), and reputed Private Organizations fulfilling the requirements stipulated under Clause 7.2.1(ii) above shall be considered for evaluation.

7.2.2 Financial Eligibility Criteria:

The Bidder must have received contractual payments in the previous three financial years and the current financial year ending last date of the month previous to the month in which tender is invited, at least 150% of the advertised value/ estimated cost of the tender. The Bidders shall submit Certificates to this effect which may be an attested Certificate from the concerned department / client, Audited Balance Sheet or statement duly certified by the Chartered Accountant.

In case of JV Firm, either the JV firm or lead member of the JV firm must satisfy the Financial Eligibility Criteria defined above and financial turnover of each other partner of JV (Excluding lead member) shall not be less than 10% of the financial eligibility as specified above.

7.2.3 Bid Capacity:

The Bidders must have available bid capacity equal to or more than the total bid value of the present tender. The available bid capacity shall be calculated as under:

$$\text{Available Bid Capacity} = [A \times N \times 2] - B$$

Where,

A = Maximum value of construction works executed and payment received in any one financial year i.e. Current Financial Year & during the last three financial years immediately preceding the current financial year (current financial year ending last date of the month previous to the month in which tender is invited), taking into account the completed as well as work in progress.

N= Number of years prescribed for completion of work for which bids has been invited. If it is mentioned in number of days, in that case "N" will be calculated as number of days divided by 365 days. (The value of "N" shall be considered up to four decimal places).

B = Value of existing commitments and balance amount of ongoing works with the Bidder to be completed in next 'N' years. Proportionate value will be taken if the works falls during the different financial year.

Note:

(a) The Bidder(s) shall furnish the details of existing commitments and balance amount of ongoing works with bidder as per the prescribed proforma of

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MRIDC for statement of all works in progress and the works which are awarded to bidder but not yet started up to the last date of the month previous to the month in which tender is invited. In case of no works in hand, a 'NIL' statement should be furnished. This statement should be submitted duly verified by Chartered Accountant.

- (b) The Value of Balance work will be linearly distributed to compute value of work to be executed during the period "N" years.
- (c) In case of JV, the Bidder(s) must furnish the details of existing commitments and balance amount of ongoing works with each member of JV as per the prescribed proforma of MRIDC for statement of all works in progress and the works which are awarded to bidder but yet not started up to the date of opening of tender. In case of no works in hand, a 'NIL' statement should be furnished. This statement should be submitted duly verified by Chartered Accountant.
- (d) Value of a completed work/work in progress/work awarded but yet not started for a Member in an earlier JV shall be reckoned only to the extent of the concerned member's share in that JV for the purpose of satisfying his/her compliance to the above-mentioned technical eligibility criteria in the tender under consideration.
- (e) The arithmetic sum of individual "bid capacity" of all the members shall be taken as JV's "bid capacity".
- (f) In case, the Bidder/s failed to submit the above statement along with the Bid, their/his Bid shall be considered as incomplete and will be liable to be rejected.
- (g) The available bid capacity of Bidder shall be assessed based on the details submitted by the bidder. The Bidder shall calculate the value of work commitments in hand linearly, as given in Clause (b) above. However, if the details submitted is not according to linear calculation for work in hand, MRIDC will recalculate the same for the working out the value of Bid Capacity of the Bidder, and the same shall be acceptable and binding to the Bidder. In case, the available Bid Capacity is lesser than estimated cost of work put to tender, his offer shall not be considered even if he has been found eligible in other eligibility criteria as per the tender requirement.
- (h) Even though the bidders meet the above qualifying criteria, they are subjected to be disqualified if they have made misleading or false representation in the forms statement and attachments submitted as proof of the qualification requirements and / or record of post-performance such as abandoning the works, not properly completing the contract, inordinate delays in completion litigation history or financial failures etc.

- (i) In case, if the certificates regarding eligibility criteria submitted by the Bidder is found to be forged / false or incorrect at any time during process of evaluation of Bids, it shall lead to forfeiture of the Bid EMD besides banning of business for five years.
- (j) In case, if the certificates submitted by the bidder is found to be false / forged or incorrect at any time after the award of contract, it will lead to termination of the contract, along with forfeiture of EMD, Retention Money and Performance Guarantee besides any other action provided in the contract including banning of business with the Employer for five years from the date of such order.

7.3 Additional Eligibility Criteria:

7.3.1 Works in hand awarded by MRIDC:

MRIDC is aiming to construct large number of Works Like Construction of ROB's & Railway Line etc. simultaneously to complete them on fast-track basis. As every work site is unique and hence require individual supervision for adequate quality and completion of work on time. Therefore, awarding multiple works to an agency/firm in single entity or in JV is not desirable for Fast-track implementation of projects.

Contractors / Bidders (Either in individual capacity or as a constituent of JV) who have already been awarded or become lowest bidder in one or more construction contracts/ongoing tenders by MRIDC as on the date of opening of bid, such Bidder will qualify for this bid only if, the sum of the value of outstanding works and the bid value wherein agency is the lowest bidder (as the case may be), is less than 30% of the value (as on the date of opening of bid) of total awarded contract/s plus bid values wherein agency is the lowest bidder.

In case of JV, value of awarded work/completed work/outstanding work (including the bid/s wherein agency is the lowest bidder) for a constituent member of JV, shall be reckoned only to the extent of the concerned member's share in that JV.

The procedure for computation of the value of Outstanding work (Ongoing works) will be as follows:

- i. The outstanding work (for ongoing works) will be measured based on the bills paid to the contractor till the date of opening of bid.
- ii. The Contract Value will be considered as the Original / Amended Contract Value on the date of Opening of bid.

Even though the bidder meets the qualifying criteria mentioned in para 7.2.1 to 7.2.3 above, they shall be disqualified if they are not fulfilling this Additional Eligibility criteria for works in hand awarded by MRIDC.

7.3.2 Works Terminated by MRIDC:

Contractors / Bidders (Either in individual capacity or as a constituent of JV) whose Contract is Terminated or foreclosed by MRIDC as on the date of opening of bid, such Bidder will not qualify to participate in this Tender.

Even though the bidder meets the qualifying criteria mentioned in para 7.2.1 to 7.3.1 above, they shall be disqualified if they are not fulfilling this Additional Eligibility criteria.

7.4 Documents testifying bidder previous experience and financial status should be produced along with the tender.

Bidder(s) shall submit along with his / their tender:

- i. Certificates which may be an attested Certificate from the client, Audited Balance Sheet duly certified by the Chartered Accountant etc regarding contractual payments received in the past as per Annexure XV & XVI of Section-10.
- ii. Existing commitments and balance amount of ongoing works duly certified by Chartered Accountant as per Annexure XIII of Section-10.

7.5 Specialized Subcontractors

If permitted under bid document, only the specific experience of Subcontractors for specialized works permitted by the Employer will be considered. The general experience and financial resources of the Specialized Subcontractors shall not be added to those of the Bidder for purposes of qualification of the Bidder.

MRIDC permits Bidders to propose Specialized Subcontractors for the following activities:

- a. General Electrification Works
 - b. Reinforced Retaining Earth Wall
 - c. Bearings
 - d. Aesthetic Finish
 - e. Installation of Cameras at sites
 - f. Pile testing & testing of materials
 - g. Any other item of BOQ if approved by MRIDC
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
